N

Although pets whose names begin with an 'N' are loving and kind, they can at times also shun being around humans as they like privacy and time to themselves. Nixon, Nala and Norbert like quiet periods and will sleep for some time if they can find quiet periods in their households. They find small children a little bit exhausting, as the children always want to play and the pet likes the aforementioned 'down-time'. They will be fussy eaters, and when they don't want something they don't want it, so there is no point trying to force them. They also have delicate stomachs, so it is wise to be careful with their diets from babyhood onwards. For the most part they don't enjoy being cold, so if you live in a cooler climate, make sure there are parts of the house where they will be warm. Alternately, if they are a dog, cat, or ferret, some animal clothing is a good idea. Goats and horses can be rugged, too. Norbert can be rather possessive of his toys and other playing-things and doesn't share well. But 'N' pets loyalty is absolute, and they will love their families with their whole heart even if it is from a distance at times. These animals make good parents, but they are 'bossy' and like their offspring to always be clean and tidy. This animal is a good idea for a person living alone, as they are low maintenance as well as obedient.

Letter 'O' pets are very loving and caring towards their humans. Olaf, Otis and Octavia are examples, They can be also possessive, and don't like other animals joining the household after them. They will be okay with pets who preceded them, but new additions are not usually made welcome by this animal. The 'O' named pet likes to be a part of the family as much as possible, going on car rides and walks as often as they can. They also like to have their own eating and drinking items, as they don't like to share. Out of the zodiac, these pets probably make the best parents. They are good breeders, and take excellent care of their little ones, so you won't need to worry about extra duties for tiny new arrivals with this pet as a parent. They will see to it that everything is done the way it should be. They have a strong nurturing instinct and that will apply to all of their offspring. Ozzie and Oprah like toys which are simple but fun and they will also help out if their own offspring are learning to play, eat or drink.

P

Pendragon, Poppy, Prince and Prim do not like excessive noise,. All animals whose name begins with this letter like balance and harmony in their lives. They are at their happiest near a warm fire or heater, or sound asleep on the couch or floor near their owners. They are usually very attractive to look at and spend quite a bit of personal time grooming themselves. They like to play as they like to be the centre of attention. They will eat just about anything but spicy flavors should be completely removed from their diet. They are better with chicken and liver flavored food than anything. They are usually very well behaved and easily taught, and so they will learn all the basic animal tricks quickly as long as you take the time to teach them. They have a happy disposition, and so your postman is usually safe around Pippin or Priscilla the dog.

The letter S pet is very clever and they also grow up quicker than many others. Sherlock and Sigmud enjoy mastering new skills, and showing people how clever they are at everything. Because they have a great deal of personal maturity they will usually behave very well and not cause you embarrassment or wreck your house. Sometimes its hard to decide who is the owner and who is the pet. Because they like to be in charge of themselves, a firm hand and voice is necessary. Once they have accepted that you are in fact in charge, they will do what they are told. This animal is almost always good to look at, and they enjoy a clean, warm space to live in. Sammy and Shiloh will give you plenty of entertaining moments.

It is also a very good judge of character, so if it doesn't like a particular visitor, there will be a particular reason for that. Elderly, easy-going or working people suit this pet the best, as they are not particularly energetic. They enjoy being fawned over, and having all the attention focused on them. Give Tinka and Thor special toys and they will cherish them. If you take anything away from them, they will behave as though the world has come to an end. They don't make good parents but they do make good lap dogs or lap cats as being close to the people they love is what they enjoy the most.

Not to forget the good side of 'U' pets – they are very loving and caring when they choose to be, so they are a good choice of pet for those wanting affection with their animal.

For the most part, they don't need people around them all the time and are quite happy to entertain themselves if necessary, so that you can relax, too.

If you have another pet as well as them, while this is a good idea, it is important to give them both equal time and attention. Nervousness is also a problem sometimes and small children can make them quite erratic. Take it calmly and slowly and you will have no trouble with this animal.
